- •Why are you looking forward to receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation?
- •Who has helped you on your journey?
- How do you intend to continue to participate in the work and mission of the Church?
- Anything else you would like to add.

This is a very important letter. Please spend adequate time praying about what you will write. It will be a pleasure for Bishop Wack and Father Doug to receive your letters so please take this assignment seriously and make every effort to do your best. Remember to have someone proofread them for you.
