

#### Week 2: New Creation

Readings: Is 40:1-5, 9-11 | Ps 29:1-2, 3-4, 3, 9-10 | Ti 2:11-14; 3:4-7 | Lk 3:15-16, 21-22

## FOCAL POINT

As we celebrate the baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ, we reflect on our own baptism. On this day, God claimed us as His own. The Holy Spirit came down upon us and made us each a temple of the Holy Spirit. God the Father lovingly adopted us and said of us what He said of Christ, "You are my beloved son, you are my muchloved daughter, with whom I am well-pleased."

We are called to live consciously as beloved children of God, summoned to live that new life in loving communion with God and others, behaving in the world in such a way that others may witness the difference baptism makes.

Read aloud from the Gospel of Luke. Then read aloud two more times. Ask the group what words or phrases jump out at them and why?

# DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Do you ever find it difficult to believe that God has called you "Beloved"? Why or why not?

- 2. When have you been given the chance to turn over a new leaf? How is Baptism similar to this?
- 3. How does God's love for you impact the way you live in the world and interact with others?
- 4. What are ways you can celebrate the anniversary of your Baptism each year?
